LESSONS

Daniel 7:9-14

⁹I continued to watch until thrones were set up, and the Ancient of Days was seated. His clothing was white as snow, and the hair on his head was like pure wool. His throne was flames of fire. Its wheels were blazing fire. ¹⁰A river of fire flowed out from his presence. Thousands upon thousands served him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood before him. The court was seated, and books were opened.


¹¹I kept paying attention to the sound of the boastful words that the horn was speaking. I kept watching until the beast was killed, and its body was destroyed and thrown into the burning fire. ¹²As for the rest of the beasts, their dominion had been taken away, but their lives were prolonged for a set period of time.

¹³I kept watching the night visions, and there, in the clouds of heaven, I saw one like a son of man^a coming. He came to the Ancient of Days, and he was brought before him. ¹⁴To him was given dominion, honor, and a kingdom. All peoples, nations, and languages will worship him. His dominion is an eternal dominion that will not pass away, and his kingdom is one that will not be destroyed. (EHV)

^a This prophecy forms the basis of Jesus' use of the title *Son of Man*. At this point the words *son of man* are not yet a title but a description. Later, *Son of Man* is a title that indicates not only Jesus' humanity but also his deity, since it reminds us that he ruled with God the Father from eternity.

My heart is stirred by a <u>no</u>ble theme* as I recite my verses for the King.

You are the most excel<u>lent</u> of men,* and your lips have been anoint<u>ed</u> with grace.

Gird your sword upon your side, O <u>Mighty</u> One;* clothe yourself with splendor and <u>mai</u>esty.

In your majesty ride forth victoriously;* let your right hand display awesome deeds.

Your throne, O God, will last for ever and <u>ever</u>;* a scepter of justice will be the scepter of your <u>king</u>dom.

You love righteousness and hate <u>wick</u>edness;* therefore God has anointed you with the <u>oil</u> of joy.

I will perpetuate your memory through all generations;* therefore the nations will praise you for ever and ever.

Glory be to the Father and <u>to</u> the Son* and to the Holy <u>Spir</u>it, as it was in the beg<u>inning</u>,* is now, and will be forever. <u>Amen</u>.

¹⁰I was in spirit on the Lord's Day, and I heard a loud voice behind me, like a trumpet, ¹¹saying, "Write what you see on a scroll and send it to the seven churches: to Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamum, Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia, and Laodicea."

¹²I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me. When I turned, I saw seven gold lampstands, ¹³and among the lampstands was one like a son of man. He was clothed with a robe that reached to his feet, and around his chest he wore a gold sash. ¹⁴His head and his hair were white, like white wool or like snow. His eyes were like blazing flames. ¹⁵His feet were like polished bronze being refined in a furnace. His voice was like the roar of many waters. ¹⁶He held seven stars in his right hand. A sharp two-edged sword was coming out of his mouth. His face was shining as the sun shines in all its brightness.

¹⁷When I saw him, I fell at his feet like a dead man. He placed his right hand on me and said, "Do not be afraid. I am the First and the Last—¹⁸the Living One. I was dead and, see, I am alive forever and ever! I also hold the keys of death and hell.

¹⁹"So write what you have seen, both those things that are and those that will take place after this.

²⁰"The mystery of the seven stars, which you saw in my right hand, and the seven gold lampstands is this: The seven stars are the messengers of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands are the seven churches." (EHV)

The Head that Once Was Crowned | 217


- 1 The head that once was crowned with thorns Is crowned with glory now; A royal diadem adorns The mighty victor's brow.

The King Will Come at Age's End | 731


- 1 The King will come at age's end, The trumpets trill, the heavens rend, Unveiling new Jerusalem. Alleluia!


PRAYER FOR GRACE
