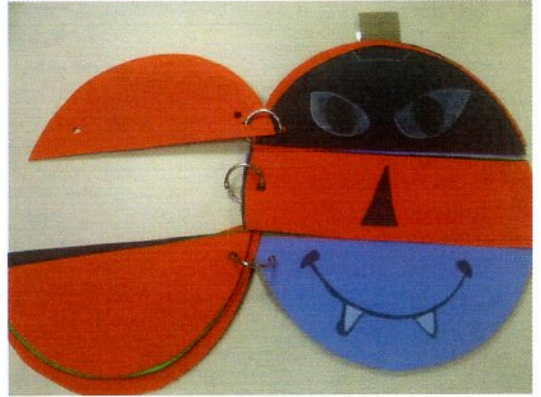


Pumpkin Flip-book

Supplies in the bag: 1 cardboard pumpkin
6 sheets of cardstock with
pumpkin templates
3 binder rings
1 cardboard stem

Other supplies: a hole-punch
Crayons or markers
Scissors
Tape
A pencil
Stickers (optional)



1. Cut out your 6 pumpkin templates (the template does not have a stem).
2. Cut along the dashed lines of each template to create three sections out of the pumpkins. You want your pieces to be as similar as possible.
3. Use a hole-punch to make the hole on the left side of each of the pumpkin pieces.
4. Punch holes on the left side of your cardboard pumpkin to align with the cardstock pieces (you can lay the pieces on top of the cardboard and mark with a pencil where the hole should be). It may be difficult to punch a hole in your cardboard – ask an adult for help if needed.
5. Lay out the pieces on a table so that you have 6 complete pumpkins. One at a time, use crayons or markers to make eyes, noses, and mouths for each piece of the flip book. We will go over a few examples in the video. Add stickers if desired.
6. Tape the stem to the back of your cardboard pumpkin.
7. Stack the cardstock pumpkins on top of each other so that all of the pieces are in the same order for eyes, noses, and mouths. Put the stack on top of your cardboard pumpkin.
8. Put binder rings through the holes.
9. Use your imagination and create some seriously spooky creatures by mixing and matching images!
